How to Take the Toei Bus

1 Wait for your bus at the bus stop


This is a bus-stop sign.

Check your destination

Check the destination which is displayed at the front, rear and on the side of the bus.



3 Board the bus through the front door


Make sure that you have change for the fare or your PASMO, Suica card, etc. easily accessible before boarding.

Note: Only coins and 1,000 yen bills can be used on the bus.



4 Pay the fare

The fare is 210 yen per ride when paying in cash (206 yen when using an IC card).



6 Press the disembark button

When your stop is announced, press the disembark button on the nearest window or



6 Leave the bus through the rear door

The name of the each stop will be announced on the bus. If you wish to get off the bus, inform the driver by pressing the stop button in plenty of time. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before standing to leave the bus.

The Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass (PASMO and Suiga only) We offer a service for using a PASMO or Suiga card as a

Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass, which allows unlimited use of the Toei buses throughout 23 special wards in Tokyo for one day. This service is available only on Toei buses on the day of use. The fare will be deducted from the SF of your PASMO or Suiga card. Please ask a driver for purchase. (Adult: 500 yen, Child: 250 yen)



[1] A child's Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass can only be charged to a PASMO or Suica card for children.
[2] You cannot charge multiple Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Passes to a single PASMO or Suica card.
[3] You cannot purchase a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass in advance. It is valid only on the day of purchase, Id Once you have purchased a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass, you cannot change it to another one-day pass or claim a refund.
[5] You cannot charge Toei One-Day Economy Passes (Adult: 700 yen, Child: 350 yen) to IC cards used to pay for transportation, including PASMO and Suica.
[7] If you wish to use late-night buses with a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass, refer to the Toei website.
