

## How to Take the Toei Bus

### 1 Wait for your bus at the bus stop

This is a bus-stop sign.  
Please wait in line at the bus stop.



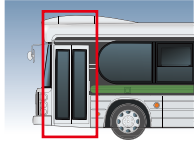
### 2 Check your destination

Check the destination which is displayed at the front, rear and on the side of the bus.



### 3 Board the bus through the front door

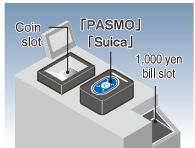
Make sure that you have change for the fare or your PASMO, Suica card, etc. easily accessible before boarding.



**Note: Only coins and 1,000 yen bills can be used on the bus.**

### 4 Pay the fare

The fare is 210 yen per ride when paying in cash (206 yen when using an IC card).



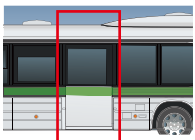
### 5 Press the disembark button

When your stop is announced, press the disembark button on the nearest window or pillar.



### 6 Leave the bus through the rear door

The name of the each stop will be announced on the bus. If you wish to get off the bus, inform the driver by pressing the stop button in plenty of time. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before standing to leave the bus.

### Tokyo Tourist Information Center

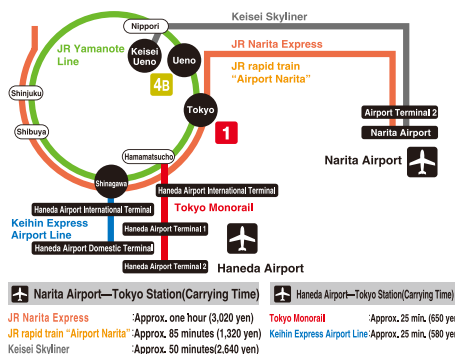

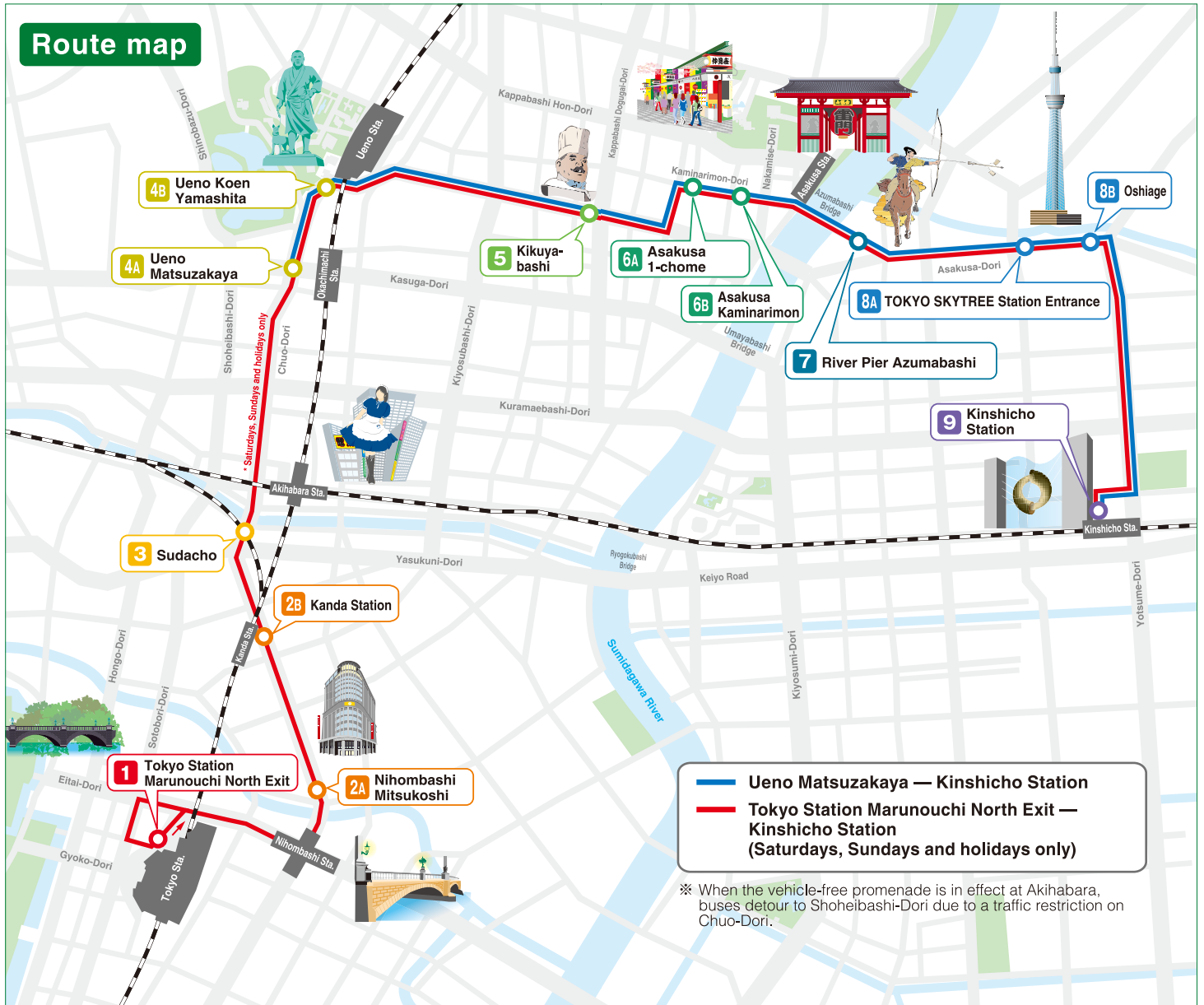

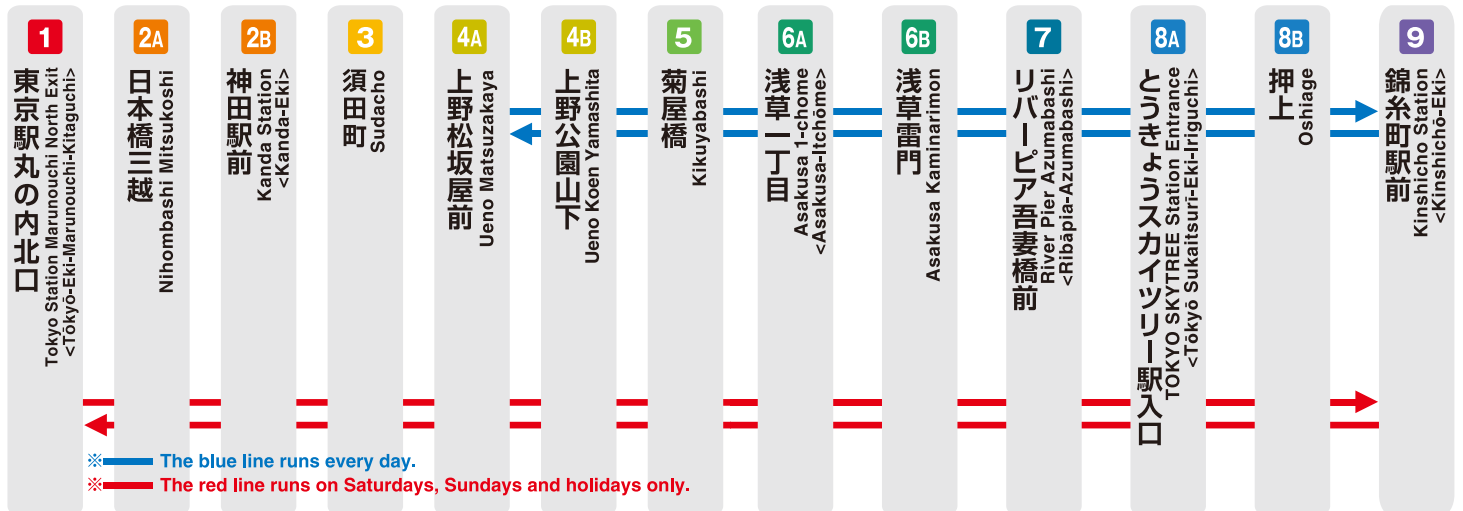


# Enjoyable bus service connecting some of Tokyo's key sightseeing spots.

This convenient bus service links several sightseeing spots in the metropolitan area. It is the best choice for first-time visitors to Tokyo.





### Tokyo Station Marunouchi North Exit <Tōkyō-Eki-Marunouchi-Kitaguchi>

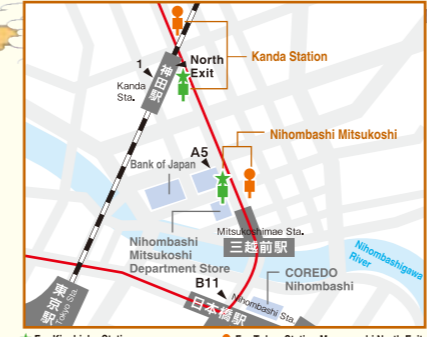

### Nihombashi Mitsukoshi Kanda Station <Kanda-Eki>

Nihombashi, one of the stations depicted in Hiroshige Ando's "The Fifty-three Stations of the Tokaido" and the starting point of the five designated routes of the Edo period, is steeped in history. Long-established stores such as TAKASHIMAYA and MITSUKOSHI are located in the vicinity of the bridge, and even today the area is continuing to develop as a center of the Japanese economy.

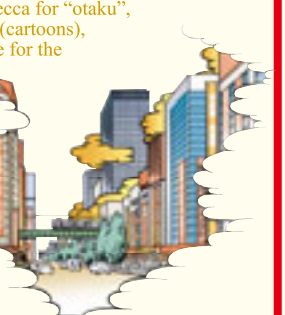
### Sudacho (Electric City)

Fondly referred to as "Akiba", Akihabara is a world-famous district specializing in electrical and electronic equipment. However, Akihabara has also become known as a mecca for "otaku", who immerse themselves in the subculture of anime (cartoons), manga (comics) and games, and has become the base for the development of Japanese culture.

### Ueno Matsuzakaya (Ueno-okachimachi Station) Ueno Koen Yamashita (Ueno Station)

Home to Ueno Onshi Koen (Ueno Park) which was Japan's first park, art galleries, museums, Ueno Zoological Gardens and other attractions, Ueno is always bustling with a large number of people of all ages. The statue of Takamori Saigo accompanied by his pet dog Tsun has also become a well-known Ueno landmark.

### Kikuyabashi (Kappabashi Dougu Street®)

A famous street crowded with specialist shops offering all manner of kitchen supplies such as packages, foodstuffs, kitchen equipment and wax food samples, Kappabashi Dougu Street® (Kappabashi Kitchenware Town) starts at Kikuyabashi intersection, passes through Kappabashi and then continues on to Iriya in the north. A large number of sightseers from overseas, including professional chefs, visit this area.



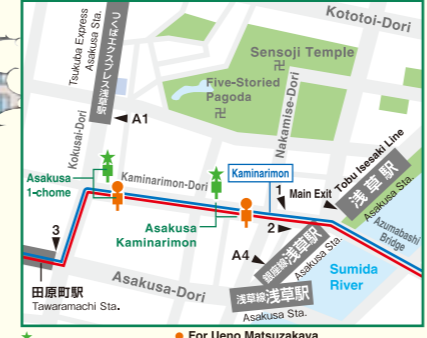

### Asakusa 1-chome <Asakusa-Itchōme> Asakusa Kaminarimon

Asakusa, which retains a retro ambience in many of its areas, is very popular with both Japanese visitors and overseas tourists. The charm of Asakusa lies in Nakamise-Dori and the other shitamachi vistas overflowing with personality and individuality that spread out from Sensoji Temple, the heart of Asakusa.

### River Pier Azumabashi <Ribāpia-Azumabashi> (Sumida City Office)

Through several reconstructions, Azumabashi Bridge is still located at the same place as in the Edo period. Along the Sumida River, there are sightseeing spots such as the headquarters of ASAHI BREWERIES, LTD (famous for the "Flamme objet" on the top) or Sumida Park (well-known for beautiful cherry blossoms and "Yabusame" (horseback archery)).



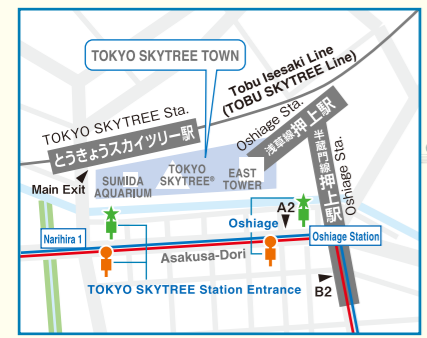

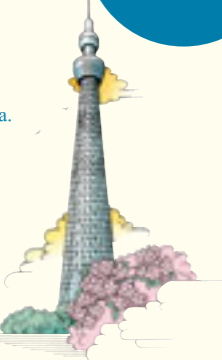
### TOKYO SKYTREE Station Entrance <Tōkyō Sukaitsumi-Eki-Iriguchi> (Narihira)

Narihira/Oshiage is a remarkable area, where you can look up at "TOKYO SKYTREE®". Boasting a height of 634m, the tower has observatories at heights of 350m and 450m, where you can enjoy a magnificent view of the Kanto area.

### Kinshicho Station <Kinshichō-Eki>

This area was once called "Kinshibori", having a timberyard and many canals. A huge bronze object (its motif is two F clefs) located at the North Exit of Kinshicho Station is a symbol of Sumida City, the so-called "Music City" which has a classic concert hall.

### The Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass (PASMO and Suica only)

We offer a service for using a **PASMO** or **Suica** card as a **Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass**, which allows unlimited use of the Toei buses throughout 23 special wards in Tokyo for one day. This service is available only on Toei buses on the day of use. The fare will be deducted from the SF of your **PASMO** or **Suica** card. Please ask a driver for purchase. (Adult: 500 yen, Child: 250 yen)



- [1] A child's Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass can only be charged to a PASMO or Suica card for children.
  - [2] You cannot charge multiple Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Passes to a single PASMO or Suica card.
  - [3] You cannot purchase a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass in advance. It is valid only on the day of purchase.
  - [4] Once you have purchased a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass, you cannot change it to another one-day pass or claim a refund.
  - [5] You cannot purchase or use a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass in the Tama area.
  - [6] You cannot charge Toei One-Day Economy Passes (Adult: 700 yen, Child: 350 yen) to IC cards used to pay for transportation, including PASMO and Suica.
  - [7] If you wish to use late-night buses with a Toei Bus One-Day IC Card Pass, refer to the Toei website.
